Kenneth R. Woods Sr. is a lifetime member of White Cross AME in Efland, NC. He serves in the church as a Steward, Lay and Male Choir President, Church School Secretary, and WMS Male Associate. Mr. Woods has served various capacities at all levels of the Lay Organization. He has served as a member on the Social Action Committee, Constitution & By-Laws Committee on the District and Connectional levels. Kenneth has been elected as Connectional Lay delegate numerous times and to the General Conferences. In the Western North Carolina Lay Organization he has served as 2nd Vice-President, Chaplain, Chaired- Constitution & By-Laws Committee, Social Action Committee, Nominating Committee, Prayer Breakfast Committee, Lay Institute Committee and served as Marshal for 30 plus years.

As a vivid community leader, he served as a Precinct Judge and assisted citizens of Orange County, North Carolina with Voter Registration for over 40 years. He's currently the Chair of the Cheeks Precinct, the 2nd largest Precinct in Orange County and the Coordinator for Habitat for Humanity.

A man raised by moral standards and always giving back, Kenneth has a passion to assist older soldiers in their daily lives. He has been a humble servant in driving former WNCC Lay President Dr. James C. Johnson for over 20 years to meetings throughout the African Methodist Episcopal Church and today he drives Mrs. Myrtle Mayo and Mrs. Hazeline Brooks.

Residing in Mebane, North Carolina, Kenneth is married to Leatrice Woods. They have four children, eight grandchildren, and three great grandchildren. Kenneth stands firm for the love of God, Family, Community, and the African Methodist Episcopal Church.

Emmanuel A.M.E. Church History



Emmanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church, one of the oldest black known congregations in Durham and Durham County, dates back to its earliest existence of 1880. Church services were held in the home of the founder, Mrs. & Mrs. William Fitzgerald, Sr. until 1883. Mr. Fitzgerald, a brick mason, was the first Black to own a brickyard. He erected a church at 705 Kent Street in the city of Durham on land he owned. The Fitzgerald's stipulated, "Should the building cease to be used as a church, it would revert to the Fitzgerald's or their heirs".

The pastors who served Emmanuel at Kent Street were: Reverends H.J. Jeter, C.S. Stroud, J.A Hunter, C.E. Johnson, J.C. Cross, Peter Crawford, G.W. Troublefield, J.E. Tredwell, P.O. James, J.F. Epps, Nathaniel Gaylord, L.G. Horton, L.O. Saunders and John R. Crutchfield.

Pastors and their dates of service to Emmanuel at the present location: Reverends John R. Crutchfield (1971-1983), Clyde Long (1983-1989), David L. Morrison, Sr. (1989-2001), Sheridan Knight (2001-2002), Shelton Miles (2002-2013) and Anita Thompson (2013 to present).

Notable contributions have been made during the tenure of many of our pastors. In 1966, under the pastoral leadership of Rev. L.O. Sounders, property on Cook Road in Durham was purchased as a parsonage for Emmanuel's Pastor.

November 1967, Rev. John R. Crutchfield was assigned as pastor to Emmanuel. Soon after he assumed his role, the congregation expressed interest in renovating the church on Kent Street. This was not feasible because the property was not properly deeded to the AME Church. Still somewhat dissatisfied with the condition of the building, the congregation explored the possibility of purchasing

another building and relocating. The Board of Trustees consisted of Brothers: John Leathers, Sr., Chairperson, Fred Hargraves, James Davis, William Tapp, Moses Webb and Sister Ethel Warren. The Board was authorized to begin a search for a new building. Brother John Leathers was informed that the congregation of Southern Baptist Church owned church property located at 2018 Riddle Road and wanted to sell it because the church had split. After thoughtful consideration and prayer, a church conference was called to further discuss purchasing the property. With less than 50 members on roll and the majority being present, the congregation voted to move ahead with plans to purchase the property at 2018 Riddle Road. The Church had no building fund at the time. Sister Helen Fike co-signed for the loan in the amount of \$25,000.

In March 1971, Rev. John R. Crutchfield and Emmanuel's members moved to our present location. The church was filled to capacity with members and visitors. New church pews were purchased, installed and paid for within 90 days. A church van was purchased; the church grounds were landscaped; playground equipment was donated; an altar was erected; hymnals were purchased; and a water fountain was installed. Choirs organized were: the Gospel Chorus, Celestial Heralds (1973); the Male Chorus (1979); and the Richard Allen Youth Choir. On September 26, 1971, a dedication ceremony was held with Bishop Henry W. Murph, Presiding Prelate of the Second Episcopal District of the AME Church, presiding. Our Presiding Elder Dr. G. W. Larkin and Pastor John R. Crutchfield assisted. The church mortgage was liquidated on February 14, 1982. This brought about an overall increase in church membership and Sunday School. Church members took an active role in church programs and activities.

Brother John Leathers and Sister Helen Fike were called home to be with the Lord soon after Emmanuel moved to the new location.

Emmanuel was growing spiritually and financially. The increased membership regularly resulted with chairs in the aisles and the use of overflow seating on the lower level of the church. Emmanuel had outgrown the current sanctuary. Rev. Shelton T. Miles, Sr., who was assigned to Emmanuel in 2002, recognized the immediate need for expansion to meet the needs of the growing church congregation. Rev. Miles started a building fund campaign to build a new church. Emmanuel AME Church had a Ground Breaking Service with Bishop Adam J. Richardson, Presiding Prelate of the Second Episcopal District along with Rev. J. Bernard Wilder, Presiding Elder of the Western North Carolina Conference (Eastern District) presiding. The new sanctuary was dedicated on the 26th day of October of 2008.

In November 2013, Pastor Anita M. Thompson was assigned to Emmanuel AME Church. Pastor Thompson uses her work experience in the public and private industry to move Emmanuel to the next level by providing spiritual and business accretions to the leadership of the church. Pastor Thompson is interested in the spiritual as well as the fiscal health of Emmanuel. Her vision is to provide Biblical solutions to promote personal success in life, family and work. As a result of Pastor Thompson's leadership, we have a noonday Bible Study for seniors, a church food pantry for the community, and Bridging the Gap Summer Program. Our worship experience is a time of honoring God, receiving sound Bible teaching and fellowshipping with others.

To register: Go to **Goodsearch.com** - establish a user name (can be your email address) and a password. When it asks you to select a cause, type in **Western North Carolina Lay Organization** - When you see our name, click on it.

Now when you need to do a search, use **Goodsearch** instead of Google or Bing and we get a penny each time. If you shop using **Goodshop**, we get a percentage of the money you spend.
