







I Corinthians 12:31 tells us of a more excellent way. Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails. (I Corinthians 13:4-8a).

When I was elected President of the Western North Carolina Conference Lay Organization Presiding Elder Wilder shared with me the words of encouragement that I carry with me in my presidency and personal life:

"The key to becoming a great leader is serving your team and everyone around you by putting them first. If you do, you'll be paid back in full with loyalty, hard work and extraordinary results."

- Love Your Team Each person has been created in the image of God (Genesis 1:27), and each of them has been gifted by God in special ways (1 Corinthians 12:11) .They are people who all have hopes, dreams, fears and struggles. And every single one deserves to be treated with respect, dignity and a caring heart.
- *Give Praise - That means a little praise can go a long way, so start making a habit of catching people doing something right—and let them know about it.*
- Seldom Use Your Power A leader realizes the only power they can use is persuasion. Don't lead with threats and fear."
- Cast Your Vision If you play for something bigger than yourself, you play much harder and smarter. And the same holds true for your team. They work harder because there's a sense of calling. So how do you let your team know they are doing something important? Repeatedly tell them what they're working for and why. Share your vision early and often.

Presiding Elder Wilder, you have encouraged, supported and prayed for the Western North Carolina Conference and we stand to salute you for your love, wisdom and presence. God has called you and placed you where you are for His purpose. With His leadership you fulfilled His call in your life and one day hear, "Well done my good and faithful servant."
