All elected delegates must be a member in good and regular standing in their local church lay (attends ½ of their local lay organization's meetings and pays required dues as set by his/her local lay organization).

Must have attended at least $\frac{1}{2}$ of the official established meetings for the WNCCLO (August 8, 2018 – 3/2020) and membership dues must be received by September 30, 2020 (Wednesday) to the membership chair Shontea Smith.

The Biennial Convention of the Connectional Lay Organization is a working convention. The delegates have very little time for relaxation, entertainment or anything else that is not a part of the scheduled program. No event or project that may conflict or compete with the scheduled program can be authorized.

With the move of General Conference to 2021, the 37th Biennial of the Connectional Lay Organization will also be moved and held in Orlando, Florida following the General Conference.

What are the objectives of the Biennial Convention?

- To set policy, discuss and recommend legislation to the general Church, and update the Lay Constitution for the next biennial.
- Participate in workshops to understand, promote and guide members of the organization to become better informed about the African Methodist Episcopal Church.
- Disseminate information through lectures, discussions and special workshops for leadership training and to stimulate more effective participation in the church and community.
- Promote fellowship among church members and leaders to help maintain organizational identity and commitment.
- To plan, structure, organize, manage and promote the convention as a public information vehicle to inform, educate and enhance all work among Church members and the public.

The program and activities planned are often changed to conform with the facilities available. These working notes shall form a guide to prevent overlapping of duties and responsibilities.

Who will attend the Biennial to carry out the work?

In the Connectional Lay Organization Constitution and Bylaws, Article IV, Section 2 the following is stated:

Section 2. The Connectional Lay Organization membership to the Biennial Session shall be as follows:

- a. All elected officers of the Connectional Lay Organization.
- b. All persons holding the designation and/or office of President Emeritus.
- c. All Episcopal District Lay Organization Presidents, and Directors of Lay Activities and Young Adult Representatives (YAR).

d. Six (6) elected delegates from each Episcopal District Lay Organization, of who at least One (1) shall be a Young Adult Representative, ages 18-35

e.

- f. All Conference Lay Organization Presidents.
- g. Six (6) elected delegates from each Conference Lay Organization, of whom at least one (1) Shall be a young adult Representative, ages 18-35.
- h. Each president or an elected representative of each duly organized District Lay Organization of an Annual Conference. A duly organized District Lay Organization of the Annual Conference shall be an organization reporting to the Conference Lay Organization's Annual Meeting or which is recognized by the Conference as an organization. (Currently this does not apply to the Western North Carolina Conference Lay Organization).
- i. Each president or an elected representative of each organized Station or Circuit Organization.


