#### 2<sup>nd</sup> Episcopal District of the African Methodist Episcopal Church Calls US Senate to Action

The 2nd Episcopal District of the African Methodist Episcopal Church joins in lament with the Floyd family. We are united in the continued expressions of profound grief and sympathy on the tragic loss and senseless murder of Mr. George Perry Floyd, Jr.

On May 25, 2020, then Minneapolis Police Officer Derek Chauvin was captured on video pinning Mr. Floyd to the ground for 9 minutes and 29 seconds, which ultimately led to his untimely death. Today, we celebrate, with many around the nation, the guilty verdicts handed down through the Hennepin County court. Though only one case, today's verdict signifies that our justice system has the potential to render justice for people of color. We are still left to wrestle with video images of former Officer Kim Potter, who shot and killed 20-year-old, Daunte Wright just 10 miles from where Mr. Floyd was killed. For a \$20 bill and an air freshener 2 fathers, 2 sons, 2 brothers, 2 humans have lost their lives. Death is the unfortunate circumstance of too many Black women, men, and children, who become victims of police brutality and excessive force when encountering law enforcement. Too often these deadly outcomes are without just recourse. Each case continues to unveil the racial bias that occurs in policing practices across the nation.

We are committed to ensuring that justice is administered to all who are adversely impacted by current policing practices that have wrought harm to our communities. It is our intent to continue to organize, mobilize, and equip our congregations and communities to advance the much-needed change.

We call on the United States Senate to begin addressing this issue of injustice, that has proven to be deadly to the Black community at disproportionate rates, by passing the George Floyd Justice in Policing Act (H.R. 1280).

- This bill increases police accountability concerning police conduct.
- It limits qualified immunity as a defense, limits the unnecessary use of force and restricts the use
  of no-knock warrants, chokeholds, and carotid holds that have contributed to immeasurable loss
  of life.
- The passage of this bill would also create the National Police Misconduct Registry that would keep record of complaints and officer misconduct.

Micah 6:8 asks the question, what has The Lord required of us, but that we do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with our God. To "walk humbly" with God means to "walk where God walks." Scripture is very clear that God walks alongside the oppressed. Therefore, we must walk where God's footprints lead us in the fight for justice and equality.

#### **COVID-19 Community-wide Vaccination Clinic**

Greater Bethel AME Church in conjunction with Atrium Health sponsored a community-wide COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic for phases 1 thru 3 on Friday, March 12, 2021 in the main parking lot at 5232 The Plaza, Charlotte, NC.

The goal was to vaccinate 300 individuals on a first come, first serve, no appointment necessary basis between the hours of 9:00 a.m. - 2:30 p.m.

Prior to the first shot given, there were a large number of individuals lined up prior to receiving their first Moderna shot.

Volunteers from the Greater Bethel AME Church assisted Atrium Health at the vaccination clinic as well as calling members, friends and informing the community regarding the clinic.

In addition, our own First Family (Pastor Abdue Knox & Sis. Rashida Knox) received their 1<sup>st</sup> shot in addition to numerous Bethel membership.

Atrium Health administered 279 shots on that day and the second dose of vaccine to be distributed on April 9, 2021.

Roughly one month later, Atrium Health returned to administer 281 second doses of the Moderna Vaccination. NOTE: *This was a excellent showing*.



The COVID-19 pandemic has brought overwhelming grief to many families. At FEMA, our mission is to help people before, during and after disasters. We are dedicated to helping ease some of the financial stress and burden caused by the virus.

Under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021 and the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, FEMA will provide financial assistance for COVID-19-related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020.

We are working with stakeholder groups to get their input on ways we can best provide this assistance, and to enlist their help with outreach to families and communities. FEMA will begin to implement COVID-19 funeral assistance in April.

Additional guidance is being finalized and will be released to potential applicants and community partners as soon as possible. In the meantime, people who have COVID-19 funeral expenses are encouraged to keep and gather documentation.

We are working to set up a dedicated toll-free phone number that can be used to apply for funeral assistance. More information will be available on this page soon.

#### Who is Eligible?

To be eligible for funeral assistance, you must meet these conditions:

- The death must have occurred in the United States, including the U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia.
- The death certificate must indicate the death was attributed to COVID-19.
- The applicant must be a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien who incurred funeral expenses after January 20, 2020.
- There is no requirement for the deceased person to have been a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien.

#### How to Apply

In April, FEMA will begin accepting applications. If you had COVID-19 funeral expenses, we encourage you to keep and gather documentation. Types of information should include:

- An official death certificate that attributes the death directly or indirectly to COVID-19 and shows that the death occurred in the United States, including the U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia.
- Funeral expenses documents (receipts, funeral home contract, etc.) that includes the applicant's name, the deceased person's name, the amount of funeral expenses, and the dates the funeral expenses happened.
- Proof of funds received from other sources specifically for use toward funeral costs. We are not able to duplicate benefits received from burial or funeral insurance, financial assistance received from voluntary agencies, government agencies, or other sources.

#### How are Funds Received

If you are eligible for funeral assistance you will receive a check by mail, or funds by direct deposit, depending on which option you choose when you apply for assistance.
