

YOUR VOTE COUNTS VOTE IN THIS PRIMARY LIKE YOUR LIFE DEPENDS ON IT – IT DOES!

EARLY VOTING April 28–May 14 is the one-stop early voting period for the 2022 primary election

2022 Statewide Primary

In North Carolina, the statewide primary is **Tuesday, May 17, 2022**. During this election, voters can choose which candidates they prefer to be on the general election ballot in November. The purpose of a primary is to narrow the field of candidates for the general election.

Races on the ballot include:

- The U.S. Senate and House of Representatives.
- The N.C. General Assembly.
- The N.C. Supreme Court and Court of Appeals.

Additionally, many voters will find municipal contests on their ballot due to rescheduled municipal elections. This applies to voters in municipalities that delayed their 2021 elections to finalize new electoral districts. This also applies to voters who live in cities and towns that conduct their elections during even-numbered years.

Who Can Vote in the Primary?

Registered voters across the state can vote in the primary. However, voters affiliated with any political party will be given a ballot of candidates for their party. Unaffiliated voters may choose the ballot of candidates for any party primary.

Note: In 2022, the Libertarian Party does not have any primary elections because there are no contested Libertarian nominations for any office. Any Libertarian candidate who properly filed for office will therefore appear as the party's nominee on the general election ballot in November.

Therefore, unaffiliated voters in the May 17 primary may choose the Democratic or Republican ballot, or, if available, a nonpartisan ballot. Registered Libertarians may only vote a nonpartisan ballot, if available in their jurisdiction since there are no primary contests for that party.

How Winners are Determined

Each candidate that wins in each contest on their party's ballot will become a nominee. The nominee will appear on the ballot in the general election contest. To become the party's nominee, the candidate must win by at least 30% of the vote plus one.

There May Be a Second Primary

If no candidate reaches the total necessary to become the nominee in a contest on the ballot, a second primary may be held on July 26. Voters can revisit this page after the primary to confirm a second primary.

Dates and Deadlines

The civilian voter registration deadline is 25 days before Election Day. Find out how to register.

2022 Statewide Primary Date or Deadline

March 28, 2022: The date by which the boards of elections must make available absentee ballots, unless reduced by five days under N.C.G.S. 163-227.10(a).

April 22, 2022: Civilian voter registration deadline for the 2022 statewide primary. (After this point, only same-day registration during one-stop early voting is available.)

April 28, 2022: One-stop, in-person early voting period begins for the 2022 statewide primary, under N.C.G.S. 163-227.2(b).

May 10, 2022: Deadline for civilians to submit an absentee ballot request form for the 2022 statewide primary.

May 14, 2022: One-stop, in-person early voting period ends at 3 p.m. for the 2022 statewide primary, under N.C.G.S. 163-227.2(b).

May 17, 2022: Election Day for the 2022 statewide primary and civilian absentee ballot return deadline.

The Maude Davis/Joseph C. McKinney Scholarship was established by the Lay Organization of the 2nd Episcopal District for the purpose of assisting worthy young women and men, of the Christian faith, in the African Methodist Episcopal Church in obtaining a college education. The 2nd Episcopal District Lay Organization will administer the funds for this scholarship, with contributions from all five Conferences in the District: **Baltimore, Washington, Virginia, North Carolina and Western North Carolina, as well as the Davis/McKinney Scholarship Foundation.** The mission of the **Davis/McKinney Foundation** is to generate and award financial resources in support of the Davis/McKinney Scholarship Program.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- (1) Member of the African Methodist Episcopal Church.
- (2) Evidence of financial need.
- (3) Must be entering college/university/training institution from high school in the Fall of 2022 and/or first year college and submit official notification.
- (4) Must pursue courses leading to an undergraduate degree or certification.
- (5) Should meet the definition of young adult (ages 17-30).

THE SELECTION PROCESS:

Recipients will be selected by a selection committee, composed of members from each of the five conferences. The committee will evaluate eligible students' profiles, academic record, financial need, letters of recommendation, biographical statement and career goals, leadership qualities, extracurricular activities and accomplishments, employment status, family history, participation in the local church, and the professional quality of the application. All applications should be thoroughly prepared and neat in appearance. The application should be typed. Applicants may fill out the initial application in draft form and finalize the application using word processing software or type written. No hand written application will be processed. Application is available on-line from Oliphantvsusie@gmail.com.

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNTS:

All conference committees have the prerogative to disseminate their allocation based upon appropriate distribution, and to select one or more students to receive the scholarship. The 2nd District Lay Organization determines the budget for this scholarship annually. **Scholarships should be distributed during the first semester of each academic year.** In the event the student recipient(s) is/are unable to attend the college, university, or training institution in the Fall of 2022, the award will be returned to the scholarship fund.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Qualified applicants must submit the following documents:

- (1) The completed application form, using word processed or typed text.
- (2) A current official High School transcript of grades and SAT scores.
- (3) A minimum of (3) letters of recommendation (Pastor or Youth Pastor, responsible adult from his/her local church, and a responsible adult, non-relative outside of church.
- (4) A one page biographical statement including career goals, and
- (5) Evidence of financial need must be submitted.

Completed applications <u>MUST BE</u> received by stated deadline. Applications with missing components will not be considered in the final evaluation.

^{**} Pastors should not submit letters of recommendation for applicants who are their children.

DEADLINE – November 10, 2022

Instructions - Proposed Legislation Preparation:

It is advised that the idea for a piece of proposed legislation (bill) be thoroughly discussed at the level of the lay organization at which it was generated before preparing a draft bill. The draft bill must address What, Where, How, and Why? Each bill must adhere to the following format:

- <u>Title</u>: Assign a Title/Subject to the matter presented (What?). The Title/Subject should be concise, yet clear, typically one line.
- <u>Reference:</u> Indicate all sections in the current edition of *The Doctrine and Discipline* of the African Methodist Episcopal Church 2012 that are impacted by the proposed legislation (Where?). Include Part, Section, Article and page number (s).
- <u>Intent:</u> Explain how the proposed legislation will impact the A.M.E. Church (How?). Include Objectives, Changes, Additions, etc.
- <u>Rationale:</u> Explain the reasoning behind the changes/modifications/additions proposed (Why?). Please elaborate.
- <u>Text:</u> The text of the proposed legislation should be printed as it is to appear in the Revised Edition of *The Doctrine and Discipline of the African Methodist Episcopal Church* see sa p e e o . ease use t e "roposed egis ation or "at t e end of this document to prepare draft bills.
- Cost: Proposed legislation that has budgetary impact must be so identified.




