

WNCCLO Election for Biennial Delegates



Membership dues must be received on or before February 17, 2015 for voting and delegate privileges in the Biennial election.

Membership dues are \$6.00 for adults and \$3.00 for youths, 18 years old and under. Membership dues must be current for voting and delegate privileges

The criteria, to be elected as a delegate from the WNCC Lay Organization to the Biennial, are as follows:

 All elected delegates must be a member in good and regular standing in their local church lay organization (attends ½ of their local lay organization's meetings and pays required dues as set by his/her local lay organization).

- Must have attended at least ½ of the official established meetings for the WNCCLO (8/2013 – 2/2015).
- Nominations for delegates will come from the floor.

Elections Seats

There will be three(3) separate elections:

- Election for delegates for the Biennial:
- Elect 5 adults
- -One young adult representative (18-30)
- -President, Director of Lay Activities and Young Adult Representative attend the Biennial by virtue of their office.
- ◆ Election of the District Delegate:

 Only one person from the WNCC Lay will represent the District. This person cannot be

an elected delegate or an alternate delegate.

- ♦ Alternate Delegates:
- -Election of alternate delegates for the Biennial will consist of 5 adult members (same number of delegates elected for the Biennial)

Ballot: Secretary will prepare a handwritten ballot based on said names. Copies will be made of the ballot and given to all voting members.

Sister Janie Wilson, will be prepared to review her records on the said nominees from August 2013-February 2015 to

assure all are in order.

Effective Leaders—by Lee P. Washington

The greatest leader is willing to train people and develop them to the point they eventually surpass him or her in knowledge and ability.

In order to be a great developer of people, a person must be personally secure. Developing and empowering others may take them to a height of their potential that will surpass even the potential of the developer.

A relational dimension, a vocational dimension, and a spiritual dimension characterize the empowerment model of Jesus.

Relationally, Jesus calls His disciples to be with Him to allow Him to mentor them. Vocationally, Jesus empowers His disciples by entrusting to them the work and responsibility of minister. Spiritually, Jesus supernaturally empowers this disciples to carry out the work of ministry far beyond their human capacity.

Homegrown Leadership Development

Empowerment happens when leaders tech people things they can do to become less dependent on the leaders.

As people become less dependent, they assume leadership for those areas themselves, accepting responsibility for the success or failure of the enterprise.

New leaders are created and inspired when existing leaders show faith in their followers and help them to develop and hone leadership skills and abilities they didn't know they possess.

It should be obvious that if potential leaders are unaware of the skills and abilities they possess, they will not be inclined to seek leadership development on their own.
